It is almost time for the membership of Sweet Adelines International to elect three members who will serve three-year terms on the International Board of Directors beginning May 1, 2022. The 2021 election of International Board of Directors members for the 2022-2025 term will be conducted electronically. Please click on the following link to view Frequently Asked Questions regarding the Board election.

Voting is a very important right and privilege of membership. It is each member's ability to participate in the choice of who will lead our organization. Please emphasize the importance of voting to your members and join everyone around the world in choosing our International Board of Directors. Your vote makes a difference!

In late September, each Chapter President/Team Coordinator will be sent an email with information on how to complete the online voting procedure. If your chapter does not receive an instructional email (be sure to look in your spam file) contact the Corporate Services department at international headquarters (corp_secy@sweetadelines.com).

The nominee biographical information and photos have been linked to the website and you may view them by clicking on the following link – 2021 BOARD NOMINEE FLYER. Please provide the flyer to your chapter members to acquaint them with the candidates prior to voting.

The officers of the chapter should schedule an election meeting (regular or special) for the specific purpose of voting. This meeting should take place between October and November. Each Chapter President/Team Coordinator is responsible for ensuring that their chapter casts its vote by the **December 1, 2021, 3:00 p.m.** Central Time deadline.

A checklist of election responsibilities for the chapter and its officers may be viewed by clicking on the following link – Chapter Checklist of Election Responsibilities - Chapter Balloting Information. Page two of the checklist document contains a "Ballot For Chapter Voting" which is being included for your convenience. The "Ballot for Chapter Voting" can be copied, cut in half, and distributed to your members on the day of the election. Once the chapter votes are tabulated by a tellers' committee of two or more people, you or your designee will use the online voting service provided to cast the ballot for your chorus. A confirming receipt from the voting service will affirm that the vote has successfully been cast.

Is My Song Admissible for Performance?

So you have heard about the Song Assessment process that Sweet Adelines International has instituted, and you aren't sure how to go about finding out if your chorus/quartet songs are approved for performance. Here's a short course to get you started.

It's important to know that songs need to be on the approved list for performance at contest (and for the public in general). If a song that hasn't met the criteria is performed at contest, the contestant could be disqualified. In order to keep that from happening, the contestant must file paperwork ahead of time to assure that their song is admissible. Hopefully, this will all be communicated clearly to the membership soon.

Until then, however, we can check to see if our songs are on the approved list. Here are the steps to follow to check that out:

 Log onto the Sweet Adelines International website.



- Highlight the "Education" heading.
- From the drop down list under "Education," choose "DEI Member Resources" and click on that.
- Under that you will find "Song Assessment Tool." Click on that.
- Under the heading "How It Works" click on "First Step" (View the Song Evaluation Database.)

- The Database shows the last date it was updated and lists all the songs that have been evaluated.
- You will see the Arranger, whether the song is admissible or not, and a link to show research that has been done on the song.

If your song is on the list and is shown to be admissible under that particular arranger, you're good!

It has been suggested that you check on your competition songs first, and then dig into your complete repertoire. The database is quite large by now (as of August 17, 2021, there were 1351 listings), and it is likely your song has already been approved.

If the song is NOT listed, go to the next steps. Be sure to read through everything before submitting a song through the tool for the first time. You are going to need to be ready to answer a few questions: Your full name; email address; quartet/chorus; region; style of the song (ballad, uptune, swing, etc.); year the song was written; who was the lyricist and composer; link to the original song; history of the song. Once you begin your submission process, save your work because you will not be able to go back to the beginning.

Remember, Region 6 has lots of help for you if you need it.

Under the Region 6 website Members section, Teaching Resources, you will find Kay Bromert's Zoom session detailing the process. Our Director Coordinator, Megan Argall, will also be happy to help you.

Whatever you do, don't give up! It might seem like a daunting task at first, but chances are your arrangement will be on the list, and if it isn't, you are just a few steps away from success!

According to HarmonySite, the host company for our website, there have been many (MANY) reports lately of emails sent through our HarmonySite ending up in the recipients' junk folders.

It would appear that the big email providers (Gmail, Hotmail, Yahoo, etc) have been tightening up their spam filters lately. This is a problem for systems like ours, as Mark Virtue of HarmonySite explains. In fact, it's ALWAYS been a problem, and those at HarmonySite have been adjusting their email-sending practices constantly over the years to fit into the everchanging rules.

This week, HarmonySite began using a system called DMARC to try to overcome the current situation. It is also important for our members to **check your spam folders regularly** - and not just in your own email program, but also in your mail provider's webmail system (e.g. www.gmail.com, or https://mail.yahoo.com, etc.).
