Back to the Basics

The spring issue of the Regional Measures contained an informative article by Judy Weipert on the Song Assessment process entitled "Is My Song Admissible for Performance".

The summer SASS regional school included a wonderful session by Judy Posgay focusing on the new Visual Performance category. Now it is time to get "back to the basics" and revisit posture, respiration, phonation, resonance and articulation. These five muscular activities, by their overlapping and blending, become a single unit – the voice. Good vocal sound is the result of a well-coordinated physical instrument.

Start with proper "**body alignment**" (posture). Elongate your body – think of being pulled upward at the top of your head, sternum and



upper chest held high, pelvis tucked under, chin horizontal to the floor, no locked knees, put the weight of your body on the balls of your feet and then rock back on your heels. The stance of the singer should be one of flexibility rather than rigidity, which will allow for better visual communication.

With your body alignment in place, it's time for "**breath management**". Call it breath management, support, control or whatever, it is the basis of the tone. It is also an area of differing opinion among the experts. Basically, we need to breathe with a dropped, relaxed jaw, open throat and a relaxed tongue at the bottom of the mouth with the tip of the tongue behind the bottom teeth. This results in a low larynx and a silent breath. A noisy breath is incorrect

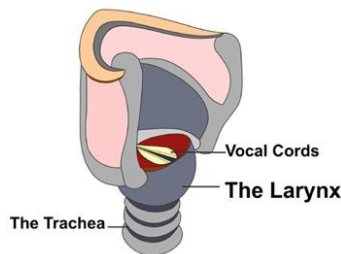


breathing. A good way to open your throat is to imagine biting into an apple. The throat will open, the tongue will get out of the way and the soft palate will rise.

Proper breathing is a matter of “letting” the air in by relaxing the frontal wall (your abdomen). The diaphragm lowers giving the lungs room to expand and fill with air. Allow the air in and “hiss” or lip trill to use it. A whole separate article can be written on proper breath support and management.



Next in line is “**phonation**”. What is phonation? It is the act or process of generating vocal sound at its point of production at the glottis (the opening between the vocal cords).

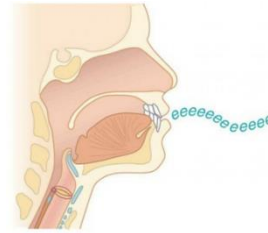


When the vocal cords approximate or close, there must be a coordination process with the breath. If air is released before

they approximate, we will have breathy tone. If released late, the tone will be tight. The throat must be open and the larynx low when we produce tone. Phonate by doing little, high puppy cries, yawn sighs and bubbling. As you phonate feel the abdominal muscles lift against the diaphragm.

“**Resonation**” is the amplification and enrichment of the tones produced. The name of the game here is “relaxation for resonance”. The chief resonators are the pharynx (the throat above the larynx) and the mouth. The sinuses, chest and whole body also act as resonators. Vocalizing on an “oh” or “oo” helps to lower the

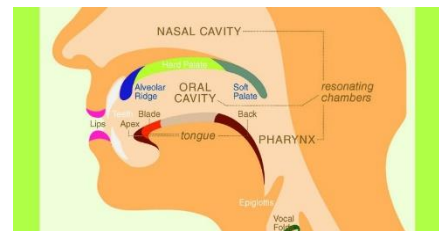
larynx. Resonance is usually felt as some kind of vibratory sensation in the facial or head areas and sometimes in the upper chest as well. The speaking and singing voice use the same muscular setup. A well-produced speaking voice can help the singing voice and vice versa. My voice teacher used to say “speak it – sing it”. We talk about placement and focus. The “m-



hum” is a good tool to help discover a well-focused tone. Exercises using “ng” such as: ning-ee, zing, zay, zah and ming are good for resonance.

Last but not least is “**articulation**”. Articulation gives a definite meaning to the tone and engages the listener. As William Rice states in his “Basic Principles of Singing” – “the procedure for obtaining good diction can be easily stated: produce a pure vowel without distortion or “chewing”, attach the proper consonants quickly and clearly and move instantly into the next pure vowel sound. That’s all there is to it.” Often, we are good at using our air on the vowel sounds and forget that consonants also need air and are in the front.

A good articulation exercise done on one note (or chord) is: the lips the tip of the tongue and the teeth.



As we work to develop our voices, we must be familiar with the mechanism, but more than that, we must have a listening attitude and a “letting go” to allow the voice to be free and undisturbed. We then can make beautiful sounds. Review these basics and apply them to your “admissible song” along with your “visual performance” as you tell your story.

Sound Cascade

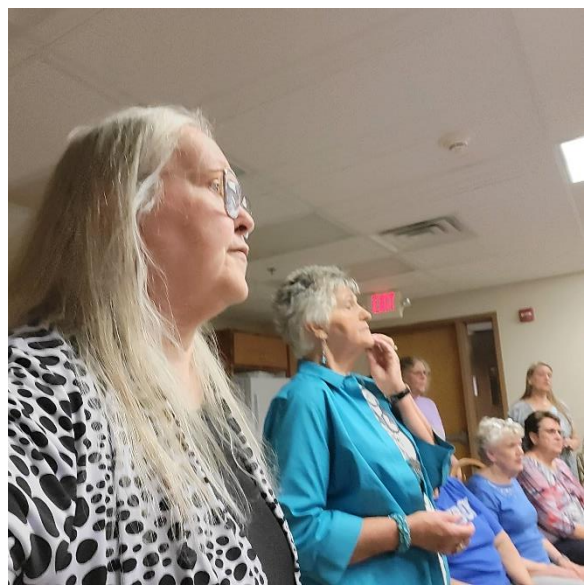
